Private Cremation

With a private cremation, your pet is cremated individually, and only their ashes are returned to you. Your pet's ashes can be returned in a complimentary scatter tube, which is suitable for keeping or scattering at a later date. If you would prefer something more personal, you may choose from a wide selection of beautiful memorial urns, keepsakes, jewellery and other remembrance items available through our cremation provider. If you already have a special urn, box, or other meaningful container, you are welcome to bring it to us. We can arrange for your pet's ashes to be placed into your chosen item before they are returned to you.

Communal Cremation

With a communal cremation, your pet is cremated respectfully alongside other beloved pets. Their cremated remains are not returned; instead, they are scattered with care throughout our cremation provider's beautiful woodland memorial area.

Home Burial

If you would like to take your pet home for burial, this is also an option. If you are considering a home burial, please let a member of our team know so we can discuss any local bylaws or recommendations that may apply.
